DON'T FORGET

AM

FENWAY PARK

From your hotel, either walk or take the Green Line to Fenway Park — the oldest Major League ballpark! Take a tour here for a mix of team, ballpark and player history.

Bags are not allowed unless they are for medical or childcare (think diaper) purposes.

MATTHEWS ARENA

Take the Green Line from Kenmore to Copley, then switch to the E line to the Symphony Hall stop. From there, head to historic Matthews Arena (formerly Boston Arena).

PM

Lunch time! Walk from Matthews Arena to the Prudential Center and visit a lunch spot near there — Eataly and Flour Bakery are local favorites, or you can grab ready-made items at grocery stores like Star Market or Trader Joe's.

TD GARDEN

Hop back on the Green Line and travel to North Station, home of the TD Garden, where the Bruins and Celtics play. If there isn't an event at the Garden that evening, take a tour of The Sports Museum.

Tours are walk-in only. To purchase tickets, head to The Sports Museum's info desk in North Station.

Day 1 of your tour might be best capped off by heading back to Fenway and taking in a Red Sox game. Otherwise, grab an easy dinner at Hub Hall at North Station or another great food hall or restaurant nearby.

HARVARD STADIUM

Grab a light breakfast at your hotel and drive to Harvard Stadium.

The second day of this itinerary is much more customizable and requires a car for some stops.

BOSTON LANDING

Boston Landing in Brighton hosts hosts Warrior Ice Arena (training home of the Boston Bruins) and Aurbach Center (training home of the Boston Celtics).

PM

Have lunch at one of the Boston Landing restaurants.

GILLETTE STADIUM

Jump on the Mass Pike to 95 South and drive to Foxboro, Massachusetts, to visit Gillette Stadium, home of the New England Patriots.
